Shri Raghunath Kirti Campus established under the Central Sanskrit University (Established by an Act of Parliament formerly Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Deemed to be University), Under Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India. This Institution has its own glory in the history of dev Boomi Uttrakhand , as the supporter or protector of Sanskrit language. The students have to acquire the Knowledge of Veda, Vyakaran, Jyotish (Ganit & Falit) Sahitya, and Nyaya Darshanam in Sanskrit Language from Prak-Shastri (Inter) to Acharya (Post Graduate) as well as Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.) too. The newly established campus now functions with six departments (Vyakarana, Jyotisha, Sahitya, Veda, Modern and Nyaya) and it runs in the earlier constructed limited space of the former Mahavidyalaya with around hundred students admitted to different classes of Prak Shastri, Shastri and Acharya level. Here the regular teachings to all the subjects are being imparted to those bonafied Students by fifteen well-versed teachers of different disciplines. Besides,

the modern Subjects like Hindi, English, History and computer science etc. are also being taught along with traditional subjects up to graduation (Shastri) level. Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.) course is also to be started which is specifically meant for the training of Sanskrit teachers. Time to time the Campus also organizes National Seminars, Work-shops and Extension Lectures etc. department wise. Besides, the campus is research programmes obviously leading to the award of Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.) degree.
